Club Success Awards 2021-2022

Our District Incentives have changed for this Toastmaster year. Here are the current Club Success Contests our club can compete for and the reward incentives for each. For details on these incentives, please review District 4 TM web site at: https://d4tm.org/district-awards/club-success-awards.

Magnificent 7 - Clubs that have all officers trained in both training sessions (Jun-Aug & Dec-Feb) earn **\$100** in District Credit. *Prior award: Lucky 7 paid \$75 in District Credit per training session to get all officers trained.*

Plan 4 Success - Clubs that send a copy of their completed Club Success Plan, signed by at least four officers, and a photo/screenshot of the team working on the plan by September 15th receive **\$50** in District Credit.

Open House Challenge - Clubs that run an Open House between August 1st - September 30th or January 1st - February 28th and **add 2** new members within 4 weeks of the event will receive **\$40** in District Credit. Clubs that **add 4** members will receive an additional **\$35** in District Credit. Note that new members must be new to Toastmasters or are 6-month lapsed former members that extend through March 2022. Submit the Open House Flyer and attendee list within 24-hours of the Open House to qualify.

September to Remember - The club that runs an Open House between July 1st - September 30th resulting in the addition of the most new or 6-month lapsed Toastmasters Members as a percent of their base in the District will receive **\$100** in District Credit. Submit the Open House Flyer and attendee list within 24-hours of the Open House to qualify.

Spring Ahead - The club that runs an Open House between January 1st - February 28th resulting in the addition of the most new or 6-month lapsed Toastmasters Members as a percent of their base in the District will receive **\$100** in District Credit. Submit the Open House Flyer and attendee list within 24-hours of the Open House to qualify.

September Sanity - Clubs that renew 75% of their July 1st base membership by September 15th earn **\$50** in District Credit. You can check your club's base membership on the Toastmaster International Club Performance Report.

Thrive - Each Club in good standing who has 5 members above their base or 25 members by October 31 will receive **\$25** in District Credit.

Thrive More - Each Club in good standing who has 10 members above their base or 30 members by Oct 31 will receive **\$25 more** in District Credit.

Smedley Stretch - Clubs that add 7 or more new, reinstated, or dual members between August 1 and September 30 receive **\$50** in District credit. This is in addition to Toastmasters International's "Smedley Award" for clubs that add 5 or more new, reinstated, or dual members between August 1 and September 30.

Level Up - Clubs that complete the following DCP goals by Oct. 31 will receive **\$20** in District Credit for **each** Pathways goal completed: **4** Level 1's | **2** Level 2's | **2** more Level 2's | **2** Level 3's


Get The Word Out - Clubs that invest in online advertising by October 31 will receive **\$25** in District Credit. Submit credit card receipt and screenshot of ad by November 7 to qualify.

Crafty Club - Clubs that run a Speechcraft program will receive **\$25** in District Credit. Clubs that **sign up 3** of their Speechcraft **attendees as members** will receive an **additional \$50** in District Credit. Submit the Speechcraft attendee lists within 24-hours of the first Speechcraft session and by April 30, 2022 to qualify.

March Madness & Presidents Club - For details on these Spring term awards, check link above. March Madness pays \$50 in district credit and President's Club pay \$100 in district credit. The former is same as September Sanity except in March and Prez club is achieving 9 of 10 DCP Goals with memberbhip criteria achieved, by April 15, 2022.

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


